

Summer Student Employment Opportunities

Saskatchewan Health Authority (former Prairie North) is in the process of applying for federal funding under the 2020 Canada Summer Jobs program. **Pending approval of the funding** we will be recruiting students for summer student employment opportunities in various locations. Positions will include: Activities Student Worker(s), Public Health Nursing Student(s), Therapy Student Worker(s), Health Information Student and Pharmacy Student Worker(s). Potential locations where the work will be performed are:

Meadow Lake

- Northland Pioneer Lodge

Rural

- Cut Knife Health Centre; L. Gervais Memorial Health Centre, Goodsoil; Loon Lake Health Centre & Special Care Home, Loon Lake; Lady Minto Health Centre, Edam; Maidstone Health Complex; Riverside Health Complex, Turtleford; St. Walburg Health Complex, St. Walburg and Unity & District Health Centre, Unity.

Lloydminster

- Jubilee Home; Dr. Cooke Extended Care Centre; Lloydminster Continuing Care; Pharmacy, Lloydminster Hospital; and Prairie North Plaza, Lloydminster.

North Battleford

- River Heights Lodge; Battlefords Mental Health Centre; Don Ross Centre, North Battleford; Primary Health Centre, North Battleford; Saskatchewan Hospital and Battlefords District Care Centre, Battleford..

Preference will be given to **post-secondary students** who are enrolled in a health-related discipline such as Nursing, Therapies, Social Work, Pharmacy, Psychology, Health Information, etc. Job criteria require the students to be:

To be eligible, students must:

- be between 15 and 30 years of age at the start of the employment;
- be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person to whom refugee protection has been conferred under the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Act* for the duration of the employment*; and,
- have a valid Social Insurance Number at the start of employment and be legally entitled to work in Canada in accordance with relevant provincial or territorial legislation and regulations.

*The youth must be 15 years of age at the beginning of the employment period. The youth may be more than 30 years of age at the end of the employment period as long as the youth was 30 at the beginning of the employment period.

*International students are not eligible participants. International students include anyone who is temporarily in Canada for studies and who is not a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person who has been granted refugee status in Canada. Youth awaiting a refugee status ruling, as well as those who hold a temporary visitor visa, youth visa or work visa are ineligible. As the objective of the CSJ program is to support youth entering the Canadian labour market, the temporary nature of an international student's time in Canada does not allow for a long-term connection to the labour market.

The student will work a minimum 30 hours, maximum 40 hours per week, earliest start date is May 11, 2020 and an end date of August 28, 2020. These hours will vary depending upon the job/location. A criminal record check will be required. The rate of pay is \$15.00 per hour.
